### *Student Research Posters in Urban Streets*

The Urban Street Symposium Planning Committee welcomes submission of posters by undergraduate and graduate student authors for consideration of presentation at the 5<sup>th</sup> Urban Street Symposium in Raleigh, North Carolina. The posters should reflect completed or ongoing research being conducted by students (both Undergraduate, Master, and Doctorate) in the following areas:

- Access Management
- Accommodating All Users
- Accommodating/Incorporation all vehicles
- Active Traffic Management Impact on Designs
- Context Sensitive Solutions
- Designing Consistency
- Driveways
- Design Effects on Operations and Safety
- Human Factors Consideration in Design
- Intersections: Traditional, Roundabout, Innovative
- Integrating Traffic Control Devices with Design
- Layout of Networks and Neighborhoods
- Public and Stakeholder Involvement
- Roadside Safety Design
- Safety Management Supporting Road Design
- Simulation and Visualization
- Speed, Speed Management, and Traffic Calming
- Sustainable Design

Posters will be reviewed by members of the committees and selected poster will be invited for presentation. The presentations will take place during a poster session that is integrated with a session of posters developed from abstracts and full length papers submitted last fall. **Additionally, the top three posters will receive awards of \$500, \$350, and \$150, respectively. The awards will be presented at the Urban Street Symposium.**

Posters should be 40 inches tall by 30 inches wide and submitted as a PDF. A PowerPoint template is provided as guidance. In addition to the poster, the student should submit a copy of the attached form. Posters should be submitted directly to Shannon Warchol via email ([sewarcho+ussposter@ncsu.edu](mailto:sewarcho+ussposter@ncsu.edu)) with subject line: *[Author Last Name]* USS 2017 Student Poster Competition.

Posters to be considered for the Urban Street Symposium must be submitted electronically no later than Wednesday, March 1, 2017. Posters cannot be accepted after March 1 due to the time required to facilitate the selection process. Authors of the selected posters will be contacted by March 31, 2017.
