How to Pass a Cyclist

Slow Down
 Look and wait for other traffic
 Change lanes to pass
 Cross a double-yellow line if there is no oncoming traffic



GENERAL DESIGN GUIDE

Rural Roads: Paved shoulders
Urban Streets > 35mph: Bike lanes with buffer
Urban Streets 30-35mph: Bike lanes

Adjacent to On-Street Parking: Sharrows or 7ft



"Bicyclists usually ride on the right side of the lane, but are entitled to use the full lane... Drivers wishing to pass a bicyclist may do so only when there is abundant clearance and no oncoming traffic in the opposing lane. When passing a bicyclist, always remember the bicyclist is entitled to use the full lane."
